TMI-1 Relicensing: Cleanup postponed, jobs decline, waste increases

(Harrisburg, Pa.: October 22, 2009) - The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's approval of a license extension at Three Mile Island ("TMI") Unit-1 further delays the decontamination and decommissioning of Three Mile Island Unit-2 the site of a core meltdown in March 1979.

Eric Epstein, Chairman of TMI-Alert, stated, "At this rate, TMI-2 won't be cleaned up until the next century. Relicensing adds another 600 metric tons of radioactive waste on the Island in addition to the 1,000 metric tons of toxic garbage Unit-1 has generated since 1974." TMI also stores low-level radioactive waste on site since Barnwell's closing in 2008.

Mr. Epstein added, "TMI continues to reduce staffing and has slashed 284 jobs over the last ten years. I just hope we have enough money and trained staff in place in 2034 to clean up TMI-1, TMI-2, and 1,600 tons of radioactive waste."
